

DATA PRIVACY NOTICE

Wallingford Emergency Food Bank

1. Your personal data – what is it?

Personal data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. The processing of personal data is governed by the General Data Protection Regulation (the "GDPR").

2. Who are we?

Wallingford Food Bank is the data controller (contact details below). This means it decides how your personal data is processed and for what purposes.

3. How do we process your personal data?

The Wallingford Food Bank complies with its obligations under the "GDPR" by keeping personal data up to date; by storing and destroying it securely; by not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data; by protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

We use your personal data for the following purposes: -

- To enable us to provide a voluntary service for the benefit of the public in a particular geographical area as specified in our constitution;

4. What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

- Legitimate interest so that we can supply you with food and other personal items
- Legitimate interest so that we can thank organisations for large donations.
- Legitimate interest so that we can supply referring agencies with vouchers
- Legal obligation so that we keep financial records going back 6 years.
- Legal obligation to inform the Charities commission about our trustees
- Consent so that we can circulate our newsletter

5. Sharing your personal data

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and will only be shared with the management team.

We will only share your data with third parties, with your consent.

Volunteers data will be shared only with other individual volunteers in relation to the rota where it is desirable for each person to see the communications of other volunteers.

Trustees data will be shared only with other trustees in relation to trustee meetings and activities.

6. How long do we keep your personal data?

We keep financial data for 6 years.

We keep the current year's vouchers and the previous year's in order to give anonymised statistical evidence to funding bodies.

7. Your rights and your personal data

Unless subject to an exemption under the GDPR, you have the following rights with respect to your personal data: -

- The right to request a copy of your personal data which the Wallingford Food bank holds about you;

- The right to request that the Wallingford Food Bank corrects any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for the Wallingford Food Bank to retain such data;
- The right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time
- The right to request that the data controller provide the data subject with his/her personal data and where possible, to transmit that data directly to another data controller, (known as the right to data portability), (where applicable)
- The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing;
- The right to object to the processing of personal data, (where applicable)
- The right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office.

8. Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Data Protection Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use prior to commencing the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing.
